Suchetna (Bareilly Diocesan Social Service Centre) is a registered charitable society, registered under Society Registration Act 1860, since 1989. It has roots in 3 districts of Uttar Pradesh namely, Bareilly, Pilibhit, and Shahjahanpur and in 6 districts of Uttarakhand namely Almora, Bageshwar, Champawat, Nainital, Pithoragarh and Udham Singh Nagar. It has spread its social development activities in 780 villages, of 39 blocks and 19 Nagar Panchayats, through 20 sub-centers in the diocese. Suchetna intervenes in the issues of the target groups (Children, Adolescent Girls, Youth, Women, Men, Farmers, rag pickers and Children and Youngsters with Disability) and brings about social, economic, educational, political and behavioral changes among them.

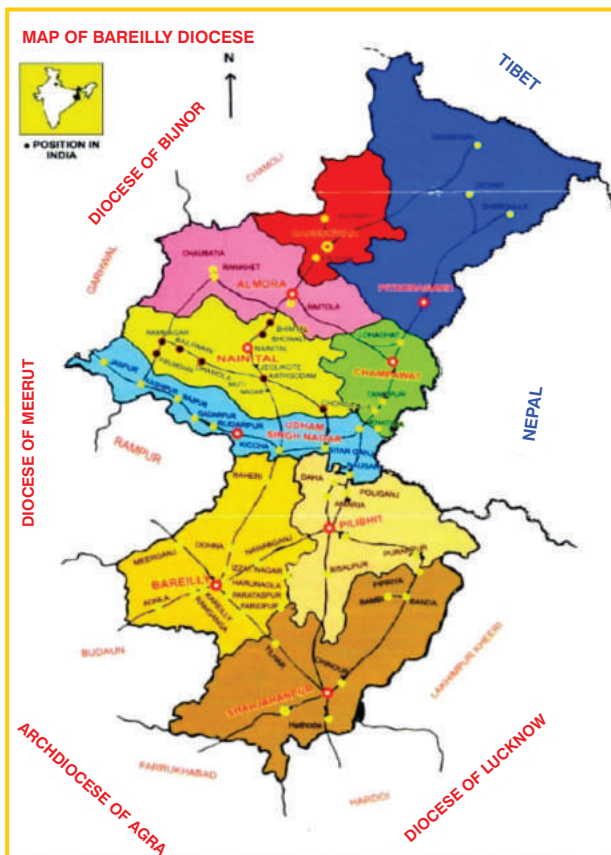
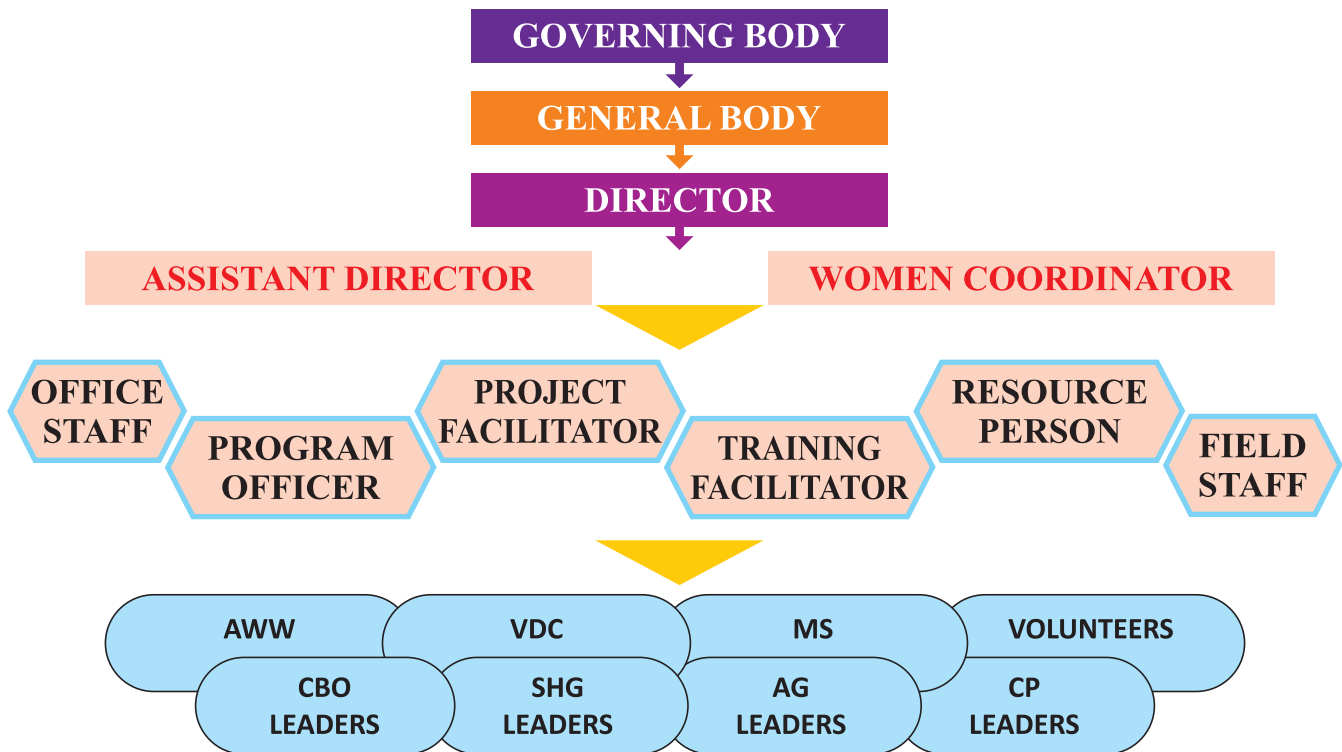

Women had been an integral part of our society yet are always neglected and deprived of their rights. Suchetna focused on their fundamental requirements like Health, Literacy, Financial Independence, Legal rights, Self-awareness, Leadership, Domestic Violence etc. and through our different approaches like introducing them to IGP training, forming SHGs, tailoring classes, skill training, Health and awareness camps, workshops on their rights and other training have brought about considerable positive changes in their life, as now they are taking active participation in decision-making, not only at their homes but also at the Panchayat level, increase in literacy rate, aware of their rights, about their health and hygiene and many of them are now self-employed.

Young girls in the village have always been the most marginalized group in society with regard to their health, nutrition, education, or legal rights, they are the most ignored. With our constant efforts, we are trying to Empower them and make them part of mainstream society. A lot of trainings are organized on Skill development like Tailoring, Embroidery, Beautician course, Computer training; Workshops on Leadership, Personality Development, Capacity building, Yoga, self-defense, basic electric course; Awareness classes on Health and hygiene, nutritious diet (food and flag), backyard farming, first aid, legal rights, domestic violence, gender distinction, seasonal diseases, government schemes, IGP; Exposure programs to Important places, Police stations, Banks, Post Office and Family court.

It is said that children are the future of society, but we need to remember that they are not only the future, but the 'Present' of society. They need to be motivated and nourished to contribute to society at a tender age. For this purpose, we have formed Child Parliament (CP) groups at most of our centers. Through these Parliaments, the children are involved in the process of thinking, planning, resolving and decision-making, which helps them in building a strong, just and rightful character and to be strong and responsible leaders. The children are given Portfolios like in the Parliament and are motivated to be responsible for the development of the village in small ways like, cleanliness drive, plantation and protection of plants, kitchen gardens, save water, electricity and paper, focus on health and hygiene, awareness rallies and campaigns, saving pocket money and help the needy, writing application to Panchayat for common needs etc.

With the current environment scenario and advancing technologies small farmers are facing much difficulty to cope up. They are not only facing financial crisis due to unevenness in nature, but also due to lack of knowledge about advancement in farming techniques and government schemes. Suchetna aims at building the farmer's groups and making them aware of the safe, sustainable and local farming (Organic farming, pest management, water- conservation, seed preservation etc.), claim for different govt. schemes, training on improved livestock management and introducing them to new farming techniques.

SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAM

*“The goal of early childhood education should be to activate the child's own natural desire to learn.”
- Maria Montessori*

The school Readiness Program is focused on small children, of the age of 3 to 6 years. It is designed in a way that learning could be made creative and fun and increase attendance through 11 step methodology, so that they take much interest in the subject, and learn to their best potential. It is implemented at Anganwadis (AW), with the support of the ICDS officials, by training the Anganwadi Tutors and helpers, providing and training them with Teaching Learning Materials and strengthening the Mata Samiti (MS) members to monitor and support the centres.

Through our intervention the AWs have become active and vibrant, there is considerable increase in the attendance of children, they stay longer period of time in the centre and MS members have become active to monitor and support the centres.

By supporting their education, nutrition, medical and through skill training, we are trying to give them a new insight to look at their life and experience a normal and respected life as everyone else around them.

INTERVENTION WITH RAGPICKERS

Despite so much advancement and development, it is very painful to see small children and young girls engaged in the work of Rag picking early in the morning every day. In Haldwani at Rajpura and Dholak Basti there are several migrants who are engaged in this work and all these people are illiterate and subjected to very degrading inhuman situations. Suchetna is trying it's best to give these people a better way of life. Through 'Apna Ghar Siksha Kendra', we are educating around 50 children every year and then enrolling them in Government schools. For the young girls along with basic literacy, we have 2 Tailoring centres where they learn tailoring, and bag making along with several awareness programs on education, health and hygiene, legal rights, personality development, moral values, facts of life, outings etc. Every day these children are provided with nutrition and cultural programs are arranged for them at the centre and at Suchetna during the major Festivals and Important days. We can see a drastic change in the lives of the children those who come to the centre to learn. Of course lot has to be done still.



HEALTH

Keeping society in a healthy state has always been a major thrust of Suchetna and to fulfil this aim periodic general health camps, health checkups and health awareness camps were organized at all our centers. To ensure good health, especially for the women and children, the concepts of a Healthy Diet (Food and Flag), Healthy cooking, Colostrum feeding, Preventive measures, Kitchen Garden, etc. have been introduced in all the projects. The use and training for Home remedies and herbal medicines, organic farming and gardening is also promoted.

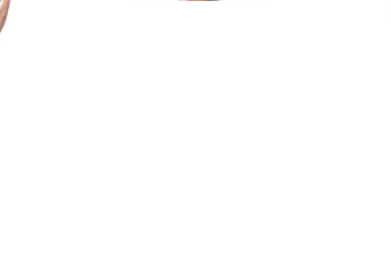

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TO SAVE LIFE

'A healthy environment is the right of every human being.' - Pope Francis

Climate Change is one of the most important concerns of the present time. The continuously degrading state of the environment is affecting everyone. It is the responsibility of each individual to make efforts to save our environment. Suchetna through its various centers and in collaboration with the 'Go Clean Go Green' NGO at Haldwani, is working to safeguard the environment.

Through 'Mission 0 Plastic' program, we are creating awareness of the hazards of plastic and collect and send for recycling all types of plastic waste. Through this program, 40 schools in Haldwani are covered and motivated to enroll approximately 2000 student environment soldiers, who motivate other children to collect plastic in the schools once a week. And also covering around 3000 households for plastic collection through Environment Ambulance which is sent for recycling.

In all the centers and all the target villages, people, especially the women groups, Kishori groups and the Child Parliament groups are motivated for plantation and protection of plants, organic farming, cleanliness drives, to prepare herbal and kitchen gardens, , to save water, electricity and paper.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

COVID-19 has become what we call a new normal in our lives, although it has subsided a bit from last year but still the danger has yet not passed. It seems like people had become indifferent and ignorant about the corona virus and this might be quite dangerous in today's scenario. To avoid these disastrous situations Suchetna along with Caritas India and Miseror is doing COVID Awareness and vaccination programs. We are also communicating with the local government health bodies for the same.

More than 700 people have been vaccinated in the last 5 months under the project “Mitigative and preventive Measures to combat Covid-19 to safeguarding lives” and the vaccination drives and community awareness programs are still going on through community involvement.

PEACE & HARMONY - SAMVAAD

This year, Suchetna has taken up the new venture of promoting of Social Integrity, sensitizing the community and promoting peace and harmony. We realized that peace and harmony is possible only when people of different Caste, Creed and Religion sit together to DIALOGUE, take decision and find solution. Through the support of Caritas India and Missio, a common platform is formed, through 'SAMVAAD' project.

The strategic approach of WaSH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) is adopted as an entry point to ensure the participation of the local community, women, men, youth and children for this purpose 4 CBO women groups and 12 CBO men Groups are formed and are active. The difficult task of promoting peace and solidarity in the community is done through various awareness programs, workshops, dialogue, Sarva Dharm Sabha, street plays, rallies, wall paintings, health camps, cleanliness drive, strengthening health system and awareness creation on fake news and forming Peace clubs and Citizen forum.

A total of 9 student's Peace Clubs at school level and 05 Kishore Peace Club at community level, 11 PRI (Panchayati Raj Institution) committees for women and 10 Village Committees are formed to promote peace. So far we have succeeded to form and Strengthen Citizen Forums, 2 at Cluster level, 1 at Block level and 1 at District level. We can see considerable change in the attitude towards people of other faith and caste. Now they come and sit together for meetings, celebrations and programs.



VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (VDC)

The people's participation is must if there has to be sustainable development in the target villages. The interest and support to take part in the activities of the project is great if they are involved in planning, evaluation and monitoring the activities. For this purpose Suchetna has motivated the staff to form VDCs in all the target villages. They are also called Grameen Sahyog Samiti (GSS) in some centres. VDC consists of the influential and interested people in the development of the village (Pradhan, Panchayat or ward members, teachers, leaders of the CBOs) Normally there are 7 to 11 members in this committee.

Every month or Bi- monthly they have meeting and discuss all the project activities before and after the formulation of the project. This meeting is very important to take their approval before we implement the activities and also in evaluating the programs. Due to this they take more interest and support our activities. In few places when there was some problem they stood by us and supported the work. The involvement of these VDC members is essential for the sustainability of the program. Around 60% of the VDCs are active and supportive.

PME AND CAPACITY BUILDING

BDSSC, Suchetna strongly believes in fostering and conducting PME (planning, monitoring, evaluation) at the local, zonal as well as center level to provide more comprehensive information on efficiency, relevance, sustainability, impact and effectiveness of work in progress. Bi-monthly PME is organized at the local level and Quarterly PME twice at the Zonal level and twice at the Centre level with the Director, women coordinator. This not only helps the staff in learning but also gives us the means to evaluate our progress and plan according to the objectives of the Project.

The main focus of the capacity building training is to enhance the capacity and refresh the project staff to be effective and working with Team Spirit and to find alternative means and being resourceful in creating awareness in the field of social service. During these trainings following topics have been the key focus : strategic planning, personality development, rural appraisal, leadership, report writing and the four strategic pillars such as empowering animation, dialogue, volunteering and sharing.



VISITS OF COLLABORATORS AND NETWORKING

1. Suchetna was blessed by the visits of Mrs. Gloria and Mrs. Carmen from Manos Unidas, Spain. They had a meeting with the office staff at Suchetna, and visited Banda, Poliganj, Kichha and Izatnagar centers, where they had meetings with all the project staff and also interacted with SHG women, AGs, CPs, MTs, MSs, GSS, Anganwadi teachers, local leaders and Pradhans.
2. From Caritas India, New Delhi, Mr. Neeraj Kerketta and Mr. Animesh William visited Poliganj and Amaria centers to give training for the project staff and to evaluate the activities of Saksham and Samvaad projects.
3. Executive director, Fr. Pius Philip, Programme officer Mr. Lince and Programme Coordinator Sr. Merin from UKSVK visited and evaluated SAFFAL project activities at Kailash Colony, Amaria.
4. From Jan Vikas Samiti, Varanasi, Mr. Francis visited Jeolikote, Bazpur and Tanakpur centers. He interacted with the children and youngsters with disability and their parents through home visits.
5. Five MSW students from the Central University of Kerala and one student from Invertis University, Bareilly had one-month block placement in various centres of the diocese.
6. Suchetna has strong networking with many local organizations and NGOs, like 'Go Clean Go Clean', NABARD, PHCs, ANMs, Banks, GOVT and Private schools, Anganwadis, NRHM(National Rural Health Mission), KVK (Krishi Vigyan Kendra), ICDS (Integrated Child Development Scheme) officials, Police stations, banks, CBOs, PRIs, etc.

When the window near the roadside opens at 12 pm, people waiting under the trees or near the railway track rush to get their packets of food. It gives us immense joy to see the glow on their faces when they collect the packet and some of them sit there and gulp the food.

Our everyday expense on this program is around 3000 rupees.
