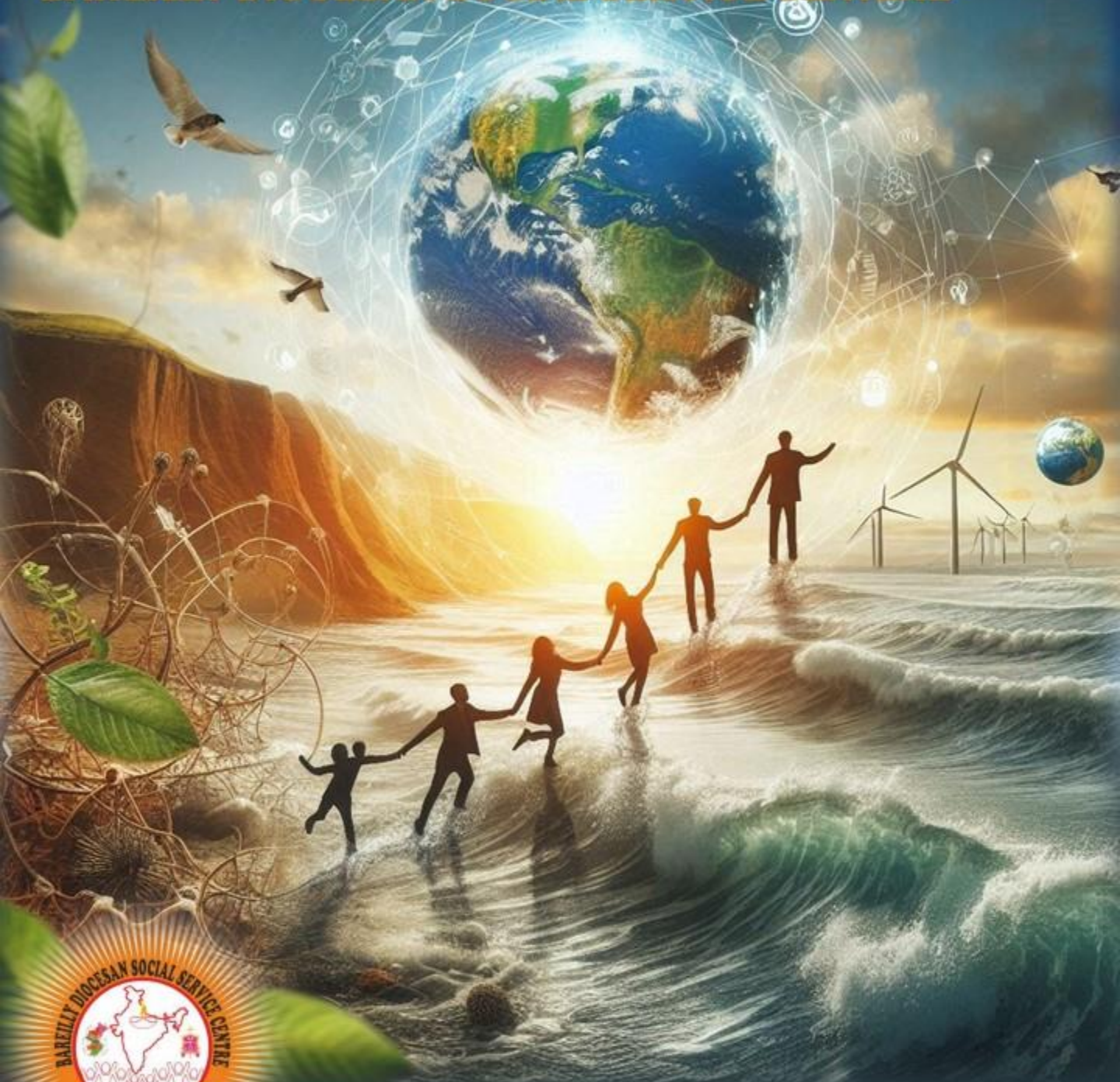

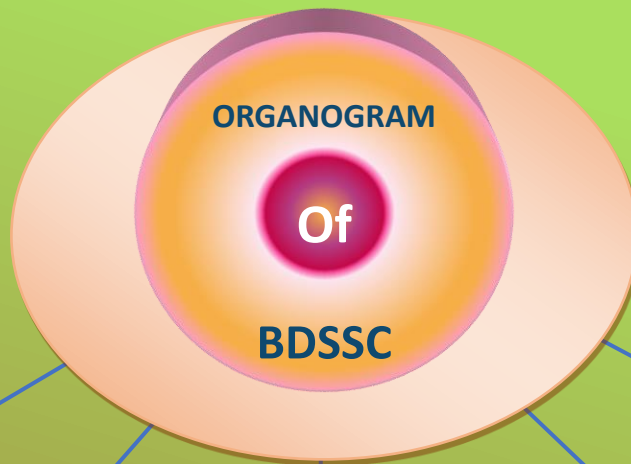

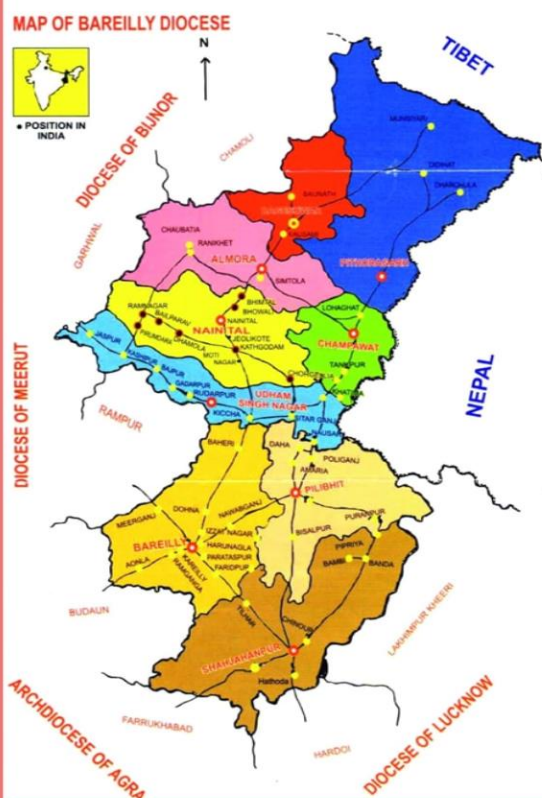

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

They address critical needs like healthcare, education, financial autonomy, legal empowerment, self-awareness, leadership development, and combating domestic violence. Suchetna's initiatives, including income generation program training, self-help group formation, and tailored skill-building classes, have catalyzed positive change. Women have become decision-makers at the grassroots level, with increased literacy, awareness, and self-employment.

- ❖ Personal growth skills (motivation, leadership, team work etc.,)

SHG Transforms Aoreya Village Road

In Aoreya village, Janakpuri, a badly damaged road worsened during the rainy season, blocking streets and making it difficult for school children to travel. Sharswati Mata SHG, led by Radha, took the initiative and submitted an application on 16th April 2024 to the Pradhan for road construction. The Pradhan, impressed by their efforts, approved the request. Thanks to the collective action, the road is now cemented, providing relief to the villagers and easing travel for children

Installation of solar lights

In Jassaganja village, Ramnagar, the NAI DISHA Self-Help Group (SHG) addressed the issue of poor street lighting by deciding to install solar lights. On March 6, 2024, a team led by Reena met the Block Development Officer, who assured support for the project. A survey was conducted on April 25, 2024, and, on May 17, 2024, the solar lights were successfully installed, improving nighttime safety for the community.





KISHORI EMPOWERMENT

In rural villages, young girls often face challenges in healthcare, education, and legal rights. Our program seeks to empower these girls through specialized training in skills like tailoring, embroidery, computer literacy, leadership, and self-defense. We also raise awareness on important issues such as health, nutrition, gender equality, and income generation. By equipping these girls with knowledge and practical skills, we aim to help them overcome barriers, improve their lives, and create positive change in their communities.

Below are some of our key interventions:



Designing dreams, stitching reality”:

Jagruti's Empowerment Journey

Jagruti, from Rameshwar, Uttarakhand, had to discontinue her education after class 10 due to financial difficulties. Her life changed when a friend informed her about vocational courses offered by Suchetna. She enrolled in a three-month tailoring course and soon began stitching from home. Her skills led to a job at a garment company with a ₹13,000 monthly salary. Grateful for Suchetna's support, Jagruti now financially supports her parents and younger brother, transforming her future through hard work and determination.

Elders' Day celebration

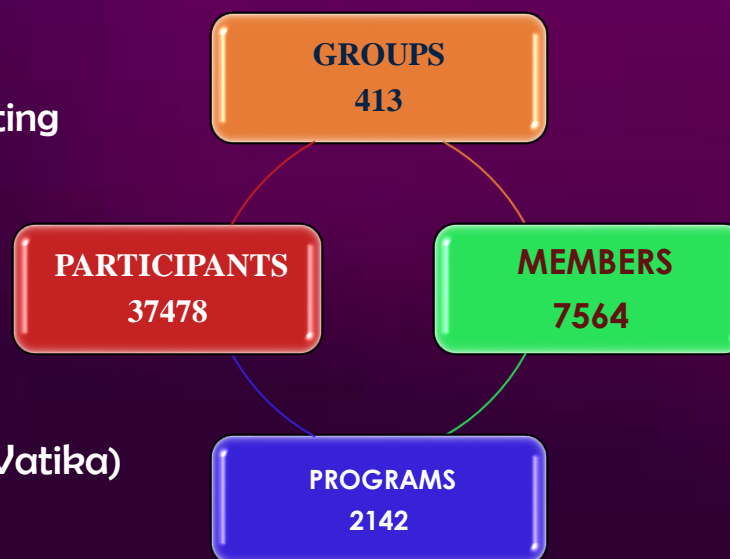
On September 15, 2024, UDAAN and SAPNA, two Adolescent girls group from Pateri village, Kichha organized an **Elders' Day celebration** to honor their elders. They invited 32 elders from six nearby villages and raised funds through their savings. The event featured traditional dances, songs, and activities, with elders being honored with shawls. The celebration, which strengthened intergenerational bonds, was a memorable and meaningful experience for the elders, many of whom were honored for the first time. UDAAN and SAPNA's leadership brought joy and inspiration to the community.

CHILD PARLIAMENT

We believe that children are not just the future, but also the 'Present' of society. That's why we've established Child Parliament (CP) groups to empower children through engaging activities. These young leaders take on responsibilities for the betterment of their local communities, from promoting cleanliness to spearheading initiatives and conserving vital resources. Join us in supporting these young change-makers as they shape a brighter future for all.

In Badapura village, Pilibhit, poor drainage and road conditions caused flooding, garbage buildup, and unsanitary conditions. On February 3, 2024, the Child Parliament raised the issue with the Village Development Committee (VDC). An application was submitted to the village Pradhan, and by June 2024, both the drainage system was repaired and an RCC road was constructed, significantly improving the village's infrastructure and living conditions.

Drinking water facilities & toilets were built (School)

In Jahangirpuri, Pilibhit District, a government school lacked clean drinking water and hygienic toilets.

On February 10, 2024, 23 members of the Child Parliament (CP) took action by submitting applications and using the Right to Information (RTI) tool. Their efforts led the authorities to address the issue, resulting in the installation of clean water and hygienic toilets during the new academic year.

The improvement significantly enhanced the school environment for students. This inspiring story shows how youth leadership drove positive change in the community.

SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAM

The School Readiness Program is implemented at Anganwadi centres (AWCs) with support from Suchetna staff and ICDS. Anganwadi Tutors and Helpers receive training, and Teaching Learning Materials (TLM) are introduced to enhance teaching.



Mata Samiti members are empowered to monitor and support AWCs. Tutors are trained in an 11-step methodology to teach creatively, and Master Trainers (MTs) are selected to train others in the block and district.



The program, appreciated by ICDS officials, has increased children's attendance and motivated all participants to deliver their best.

FARMER ENTITLEMENT

Farmers face financial uncertainties and lack knowledge about modern farming techniques. Suchetna empowers them through community groups, comprehensive knowledge, and innovative farming methods for long-term success and sustainability. Join us in supporting our farmers. Through Saksham and Saffal projects, we at Suchetna, aim at building farmer groups to bridge the knowledge gap.

CONSTRUCTION OF DRAINAGE SYSTEM

The Saksham Project in Gram Panchayat Auraiya has empowered the community by addressing key issues like poor roads and drains. A Gram Sahayog Samiti (GSS) was formed, and through Ward Sabha meetings, villagers voiced their concerns.

On March 2, 2024, a proposal for drainage was submitted with support from GSS members and women farmers, led by Mrs. Brijesh Kumari. The proposal was approved, and the paved drain was completed by June 2024. Gram Pradhan Nirmala Devi credits community groups for making villagers more proactive, while Mrs. Triveni Devi highlights the empowerment of women through self-help groups, allowing them to apply for government schemes and understand Panchayati Raj.



Sadiya village in Pilibhit faced issues like stray animals and an unsafe Anganwadi centre. Saksham, through the Village Development Committee and Self-Help Groups, empowered locals with training in advocacy and application writing. This enabled the community to address these challenges and improve their conditions.

SPECIALLY ABLED

In 2024, we implemented several initiatives to support persons with disabilities in five core areas:



education, health, livelihood, social inclusion, and empowerment. We provided inclusive education opportunities for children with disabilities. We enrolled them in mainstream schools, provided them with assistive devices and learning materials, trained teachers and parents on inclusive pedagogy and disability awareness, and monitored their academic progress and well-being.

INTERVENTION WITH RAGPICKERS

Ragpickers in Rajpura and Dholak Basti, Haldwani, play a crucial role in waste management but are often overlooked. 'Apna Ghar Siksha Kendra' engages with children and young girls in these slums, providing early education, daily nutrition, and opportunities to enroll in schools. Currently, 120 children and 67 adolescent girls benefit from the program. Two tailoring centers teach skills like stitching and making cloth bags, while also providing awareness on health, hygiene, leadership, and values. Cultural programs are organized on major festivals, aiming to improve the community's overall quality of life. Education is key to their empowerment.



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED:

Skills development program, Training on leadership, personality development, stress management, Medical health check up, Tailoring , Beauty parlor Celebrations, Healthy cooking, Awareness session

COMMUNITY HEALTH

Community health focuses on improving the overall well-being of individuals within a community by addressing healthcare access, preventive care, education, and environmental factors. Key aspects include ensuring access to medical services, promoting health education, improving sanitation and living conditions, and supporting mental health. It also emphasizes health equity, ensuring vulnerable populations receive adequate care. Successful community health initiatives are collaborative, involving local governments, healthcare providers, NGOs, and the community to reduce health disparities and improve outcomes for all members.



INCOME GENERATION PROGRAM

An Income Generation Program (IGP) aims to provide individuals and communities with the skills and resources needed to create sustainable income sources. These programs offer training in areas like tailoring, handicrafts, agriculture, and small businesses, with a focus on empowering marginalized groups, particularly women. By improving financial independence and reducing poverty, IGPs contribute to economic stability, self-reliance, and long-term community development. Through access to training and financial support, participants can grow businesses, enhancing their livelihoods and fostering overall socio-economic growth.

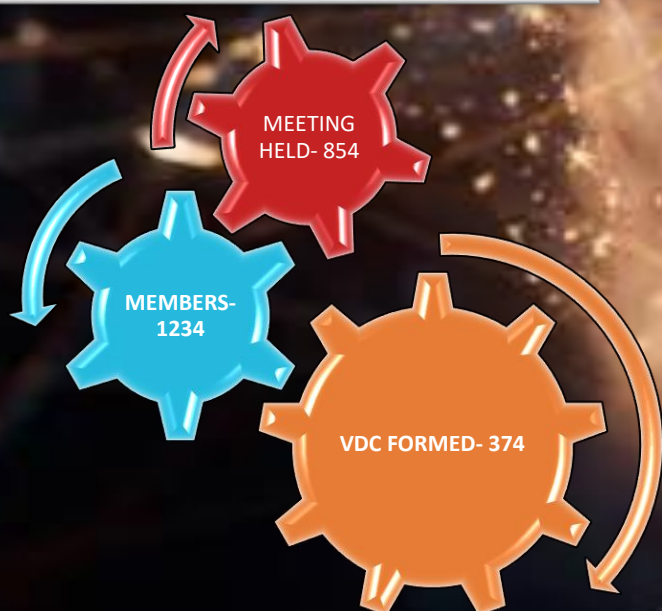

With 7 to 11 members, the VDC meets regularly to discuss ongoing projects, plan new ones, and assess past initiatives. These meetings ensure that community voices are heard and promote shared responsibility for development. When challenges arise, the VDC members collaborate to overcome them, ensuring the sustainability and success of programs. Their collective efforts drive meaningful change and improve the village's overall well-being.



NETWORKING AND COLLABORATION

In the social sector, collaboration with various organizations is key to success. From funding to execution, it takes a united effort. Regular connections with officials and partners help us build a strong network.

VASTRA SEWA



Vastra Sewa is a term used in Indian culture that refers to the act of donating clothes, typically to the needy or less fortunate. "Vastra" means clothing, and "Seva" means service or selfless service. It is a significant part of many charitable activities in India and other countries with large populations of people in need.

The idea to start Vastra Seva in Suchenta was conceptualized by Fr. Derick. The main objectives are as follows:

- ❖ Providing clothes to the needy
- ❖ To support & uplift disadvantaged groups in society
- ❖ The practice encourages people to develop a sense of empathy and compassion for those less fortunate



CELEBRATIONS

Celebrations are an important part of human life, providing moments of joy, unity, and reflection. They mark significant events, milestones, or cultural traditions, bringing people together to share in happiness and gratitude. Whether it's a birthday, religious holiday, national festival, or personal achievement, celebrations offer a break from routine, allowing us to pause and appreciate life's blessings.





EXPOSURE VISITS:

Suchetna's AGs (Adolescent Girls) and CPs (Child Parliaments) programs include exposure visits to key public institutions like police stations, post offices, hospitals, and banks. These visits empower participants with the knowledge and confidence to navigate these institutions independently for emergencies or daily needs. Through interactive sessions with professionals, participants learn about the roles and services of each institution. For 90% of participants, it was their first visit, and they expressed gratitude for gaining valuable knowledge to manage formal processes in their daily lives.



PME / TRAINING



Suchetna strengthens its Planning, Monitoring, and Evaluation (PME) through bi-monthly local meetings and quarterly zonal and central sessions, involving key stakeholders to assess project progress and impact. The organization focuses on capacity-building, offering training in strategic planning, community mobilization, leadership, and report writing to enhance staff skills and foster teamwork. Suchetna also emphasizes four key pillars: empowering participation, effective dialogue, volunteering, and knowledge sharing, all aimed at ensuring the success and sustainability of its social service programs.
